- **Dufault and the Interpretation of Termination Clauses: Navigating the Impact of Hypothetical ESA Breaches in Ontario Case Law** – The Court of Appeal for Ontario (“ONCA”) will hear the appeal of *Dufault v The Corporation of the Township of Ignace* (“*Dufault*”) this Friday. While Ontario courts previously recognized that creating jurisprudence based on hypothetical situations is a slippery slope, since the decision in *Waksdale v Swegon North America Inc*, courts in Ontario have repeatedly invalidated termination clauses in employment agreements by considering hypothetical breaches of employment standards legislation.
