"The Ontario Human Rights Tribunal doesn't regulate whether someone can walk down the street wearing a discriminatory logo," says Rebecca Jones, a partner at Lenczner Slaght, which is working with Cardinal on his complaint. "But if you want to offer a service to the public in Ontario, you have brought yourself within the Tribunal's jurisdiction. That means you have to offer that service in a non-discriminatory way so that everyone, regardless of race, ethnicity or ancestry, can enjoy that service equally."
